

"Never before a year went for me as fast as the last one I spent here in Malvern as exchange student. Never one year was so filled with new experiences and lots of fun. Of course, I expected already before I came over to like the U.S.A. and to have a wonderful time, otherwise I hardly would have had the courage to leave my home in Germany for a whole year.
