




Jacqueline Watkins, Editor of the 1960 Review, was sent to Girls' State which is sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary.

Tech High's Royalty are ready to go to the Children's Ball, the biggest Junior event of the Mid South's annual Cotton Carnival.







Although senior minds are filled with dreams of the future their hearts still ache a little as time comes to bid old Tech High Good-bye!




